courage; audacity and insistence on ideas

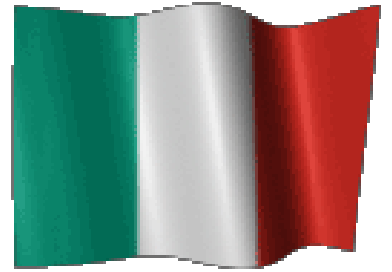

intolerant; easy-going; conservative;

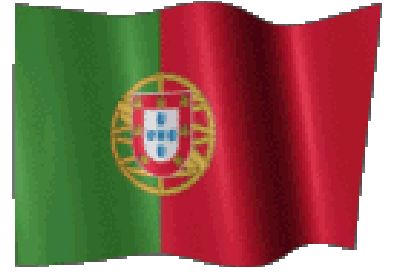
your car will be stolen, once you cross the border;

saudade

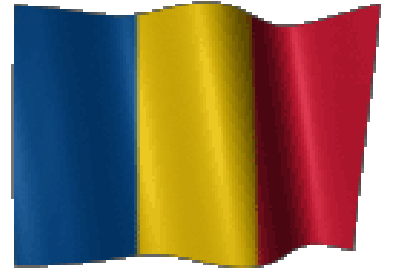
